Winterproof



BEFORE THE WINTER

Winter is just around the corner and with it come the frosty temperatures and challenges for your mobile home. So that you can get your motorhome safely through the cold season, it is important to make some preparations to winterise your vehicle.

IMPORTANT

If you intend to deregister your vehicle over the winter: In accordance with current legal regulations, unregistered vehicles may not be parked in public traffic areas. For this reason, it is essential that you park your vehicle on a suitable private property.

FROM THE OUTSIDE

- Check the vehicle for minor damage to the paintwork, repair it and preserve it with hard wax.
- Fill the radiator and windscreen wiper system with antifreeze.
- Clean all rubber seals on doors and windows and then grease them with Vaseline or special grease pencils.
- Increase the air pressure in the tyres or, if necessary, extend the lift support.
- Drain fresh water and waste water and empty residual water from the tap, siphon, toilet and boiler.
- Leave waste water valves open

FROM INSIDE

- Fit granule-based dehumidifier packs to prevent dampness in the interior
- Remove all food from the motorhome
- Leave fridge and freezer doors ajar to avoid mould.
- Vacuum upholstery, mattresses and carpets and, if necessary, store them dry outside the vehicle.
- Leave the water taps open; Attention: Switch off the 12 V supply.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Place the vehicle in a covered, well-ventilated parking space or in a dry, frost-free hall.
- If the vehicle is parked outdoors: park at a slight angle to avoid damage from frozen rainwater.
- Disconnect the battery, wrap it in thermofoil or remove it and store it in a rust-free place
- Close gas shut-off valves and gas bottle
- Fill the fuel tank completely
